This hybrid cohort for elementary and secondary teachers would run for 8 weeks (September to October 2016), meeting face-to-face 4 times (see schedule below). Upon successful completion of the course, participants will have earned the necessary credits to fulfill MDE's reading requirement for Professional Certification.

Required Reading Course for Professional Certification

RDG 5510 & 5520: Reading Process, Assessment
and Instruction for Elementary and Secondary Teachers (3 semester hours)

Off-Campus Tuition: \$568 per semester hour

Course Description: Course content emphasizes the importance of ongoing assessment to appropriately inform and differentiate instruction for diverse students in any elementary/secondary classroom. Field experiences provide opportunities to administer assessments in the following areas: interest inventories, English language learning and language expression and processing, visual and auditory discrimination, phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, spelling, writing and vocabulary and comprehension. Students learn instructional strategies needed to effectively develop these critical literacy related areas. Prerequisite elementary or secondary teacher certification.

Satisfies Michigan Department of Education requirement for Professional Certification.
